A Note from the Director



When I considered what musical I would want to direct, I thought of all the shows I have done in my past. I belonged to a theater company in Massachusetts that loved to do obscure plays that nobody else was doing. Little Me was one of those little-known gems. I played Young Belle and Baby. I remember reading the script for the first time and laughing out loud. How could you not when the script was written by the comedic genius of Neil Simon adapted from a book by the comedic genius of Patrick Dennis?! You may remember Patrick Dennis from his other masterpiece, Auntie Mame, which was made into a movie with Rosalind Russell in the title role. And ... one of my favorite movies of all time!

The plot of his book *Little Me: The Intimate Memoirs of that Great Star of Stage, Screen, and Television* tells the rags-to-riches-to-rags-to-riches, etc. story of Maybelle Schlumpfert, an overdeveloped and self-deluded young girl who rises to become Belle Poitrine. Throughout the book, Belle trumpets her successes (which are few) while glossing over her failures (which are many). In Neil Simon's version, Belle bumps into Noble Eggleston and it's love at first sight, but in order to become equal to Noble so that they can be together, she must first find wealth, culture, and social position and along the way she meets a myriad of men willing

to help her achieve her goal.

The summer I was in *Little Me* was such a special time. I loved the story, the songs, and I loved playing Belle. A family was developed amid the cast and life-long friendships were made. The show itself created an atmosphere of joviality. I knew that this show had left a mark on my heart. How lucky was I then to be given the opportunity to direct it?! Three years ago we were two weeks away from opening and then Covid struck. Although terribly disappointing, we never gave up the dream of making this show happen! Unfortunately, many of the original cast were no longer available,

so I searched and was lucky to discover a group of actors that fit in perfectly with the cast that remained. I had no idea, however, when I started directing this cast how emotional I would become the more I watched the progress of my actors. As the weeks have gone by and I've worked with this cast, I realize that I have a new family of *Little Me*-ers. I'm grateful to MBCC for this opportunity.

This experience has been magical and the cast is such a joy to work with. I look forward to seeing each one of them every day. I didn't think anything would surpass my first time doing this show, but my heart is so full of love and gratitude and I owe it all to this cast. So sit back and be prepared to laugh. You may have never heard of *Little Me*, but I can guarantee that you will leave this theater singing the songs and feeling a lot lighter than when you came in. Although, your cheeks may be sore for the next few days from all the laughing!

I dedicate this show to Bill White, my Noble Eggleston et al, who passed away in 2012.
